HOW TO PREPARE FOR AN EAGLE REVIEW BOARD

Your District Eagle Board of Review will consist of 3-5 reviewers from various backgrounds. Some may be District level leadership, Council volunteers, or community members of various standing. You will need to select a sponsor to attend the BOR with you. Although the Scoutmaster is always honored to attend, this is your choice. The Troop leadership and/or your sponsor will not know when your Board is; you must send them these details.

What should I wear and bring?

- Wear your full Class A uniform (with merit badge & OA sashes if you have them)
- Bring your Scout Handbook
- Bring any notes you wish to refer to
- Bring your leadership binder (for certain leadership positions)

What types of questions might be asked?

- Scout Spirit
 - Be able to repeat the Scout Oath, Law, Motto, Slogan and Outdoor Code and understand what each means
 - You may be asked how you live out these Scouting values in your daily life
 - You may be asked “Tell how you have done your Duty to God”
- Eagle Project
 - The review members will review your project binder prior to your arrival and will be asking you questions about the overall process. Review your project (especially if much time has passed) and be ready to discuss details of the work done, how you kept your volunteers safe, what the benefit of the project was, and how you personally critique your leadership.
- Badges
 - The review board is responsible to check all merit badges required have been completed. They will ask about different badges you may have earned, but will not ask for specific requirements. You should review all merit badges earned and be comfortable discussing a few points about each (What you liked? Didn't like? What was challenging?).
- Leadership
 - The review board will ask what you do in your leadership position. Since your application lists two leadership positions, they may ask about each or just pick one. Be prepared to discuss details about your responsibilities and remember that the board may not be familiar with the Troop's operations, so be specific.
